Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

Floyd Elementary will hire teachers who are highly qualified as defined by the Alabama State Department of Education and teach our students according to the standards of the Alabama Course of Study. The Alabama Reading Initiative, Alabama Math, Science & Technology Initiatives, and Technology Course of Study. Teachers are monitored on a regular basis and are provided with ongoing professional development. We will assess students' knowledge and improvements. In order to teach the whole child, students are offered Fine Arts, P.E./Health, computers, library, peer tutoring, after school tutoring, Character Education, counseling and After School Enrichment programs. We desire to provide structure and clear limits so that all children are treated in a fair manner. Floyd Elementary lunchroom staff will offer a well- balanced breakfast and lunch.

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.

Specifically, those conferences will be held: Parent-teacher conferences will be held throughout the school year using various methods including virtual, via phone or face to face while incorporating social distancing practices during agreed scheduled time to discuss student's progress.
